Special Rules for Target Archery Competition

1. **Participation:** This competition be divided between four divisions (Junior Male, Senior Male, Junior Female, and Senior Female) based on age. All entries in this competition are subject to the HLSR Archery Competition Rules.

Contestants in the HLSR Archery Competition are responsible for knowing and complying with all rules of this competition.

2. Entry: Entries will be made through the Eyes on Score system at https://www.eyesonscore.com/ starting August 1, 2024 and will close on October 10, 2024, or when the max entries is met. (See rule 6 for details)

3. Eligibility:

- a. Organizations: Must have a membership to one of the following organizations: Texas 4-H, Texas FFA, TFAA, ASA, USA Archery (JOAD).
- b. **State of Texas:** HLSR Archery Competition is limited to entries within the State of Texas.
- School: Contestants must be enrolled in and attending public, private, or home school elementary or secondary schools in Texas; between the ages of 8 (in addition to being in the 3rd grade) and 18 on or before August 31, 2024 and be bona fide residents of the State of Texas. Involvement in international or national events does NOT disqualify otherwise eligible contestants.
 - i. Junior Participant Classification 8 years of age (in addition to being in the 3rd grade) and not over 13 years of age as of August 31, 2024.
 - ii. Senior Participant Classification 14 to 18 years of age as of August 31, 2024.
 - iii. A contestant is not eligible if already graduated from high school.

- 4. Foreign Exchange Students: Non-United States citizens and Foreign Exchange students are ineligible to compete in the HLSR Archery Competition.
- 5. Exhibitor Code of Ethics: Per Rule 31 of the General Rules: The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo™ is a family friendly event. As such, an individual's conduct as an exhibitor or patron should be exemplary, and violators are subject to disqualification or removal from Show grounds.

Violations include, but are not limited to:

- Disruptive or improper conduct
- Public display of profanity of any sort
- Violence of any sort •
- Providing alcohol to underage persons or providing a space for the consumption of alcohol by underage persons. •
- Possession, use, or distribution of alcohol by underage persons
- Possession of an open alcohol container in a public area regardless of the individual's age •
- Excessive consumption of alcohol •

The consumption, distribution, and service of alcoholic beverages must be in compliance with the TX Alcoholic Beverage Code, which defines the lawful consumption and service of alcohol and prescribes sanctions for violations. The consumption, distribution, and service of alcoholic beverages must comply with HLSR regulations and policies.

The Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo™ is an invitational Livestock Show. HLSR reserves the right to extend, withhold, or revoke an invitation to any Exhibitor or Contestant.

- 6. Entry Limits: There is no limit to the number of individuals each club/chapter may enter. The right is reserved, by Management, to reject entirely or accept conditionally any entry and to refuse any accepted entry admittance to the grounds.
 - a. Exhibitors may only have one entry per bow class for a maximum of 4 entries per exhibitor.
 - i. Exhibitor may only have one entry per preliminary round.
 - ii. Exhibitor must provide the appropriate bow for each entry to be eligible for that bow class.
 - b. Overall entries will not be limited. Initially available will be two rounds on Saturday and one round Sunday morning for up to 180 Exhibitors per round.
 - i. Additional rounds will be added based on need and at the discretion of the Superintendent and Show Officials
- 7. Event Format: The competition will be at a 20 Yard range. The preliminary round will consist of 60 arrows shot at the 40 cm 5color face. 40 cm Triple faces will be allowed. a.
 - Targets 40 cm 5-color faces and 40 cm Triple faces will be provided.
 - Divisions: b.
 - i. Senior Male (14 to 19 years of age as of August 31, 2024)
 - ii. Junior Male (8 years of age (in addition to being in the 3rd grade) and not over 13 years of age as of August 31, 2024)
 - iii. Senior Female (14 to 19 years of age as of August 31, 2024)
 - iv. Junior Female (8 years of age (in addition to being in the 3rd grade) and not over 13 years of age as of August 31, 2024)
 - Classes Contestants will compete in the below classes based upon what bow(s) they will be shooting with. All classes C. will be available for all timeslots.
 - i. Compound
 - ii. Recurve
 - iii. NASP/Genesis
 - iv. Barebow (Cushion Plunger style arrow rests are allowed)
- 8. Check-In - All contestants must check-in prior to mandatory orientation. Check-in will be open 1 hr prior to your assigned shoot time until 15 minutes before your assigned shoot time. All equipment must be inspected before orientation. NO LATE ARRIVALS WILL BE ACCEPTED. NO EXCEPTIONS!

- 9. Orientation Orientation will be conducted 15 minutes prior to your shoot time. Orientation is mandatory for everyone who will participate in the event.
- **10.** *Finals:* We will conduct a shoot-off style final on with those shooters designated as finalists. Finalists will be announced when the preliminary rounds are complete.
 - a. Finalists will have to be available to shoot the finals or the next person may be moved up at the discretion of Show Management.
- **11. Target Assignments:** Targets will be assigned by show officials and will be subject to change at any time. Assignments will be available in the online score system; these are not considered final and can be changed based on the Shoot Officials' discretion.
 - a. Switching Targets: All target locations will be flipped on a bale after the first 10 ends for the second 10 ends.
 (Example: targets initially located at the top of a bale will be moved to the lower spots and the targets on the bottom will be moved to the top.
- 12. Quivers: Contestants must provide their own quivers. Quivers will not be provided by HLSR.
- **13. Arrows:** An arrow consists of a shaft with a tip (point), nock, fletching and, if desired, cresting. The maximum diameter of arrow shafts shall not exceed 9.3mm (arrow wraps shall not be considered as part of this limitation but may not extend further than 22cm toward the arrow point when measured from the nock groove where the bowstring sits to the end of the wrap). The tips/points of the arrows may not exceed 9.4mm in diameter. All arrows of every athlete shall be marked with the athlete's name or initials on the shaft. All arrows used in any end shall be identical in appearance and shall carry the same pattern and colour(s) of fletching, nocks and cresting, if any. Tracer nocks (electrically/electronically lighted nocks) are not allowed.



14. Draw Weight: A <u>maximum draw weight of 60 lbs</u> will be allowed for the competition. Draw weight will be verified on a case by case basis at the discretion of the Superintendent. You will be asked your draw weight during Bow Check. Anyone found to exceed the draw weight during competition will be subject to disqualification.

15. Safety Requirements:

- a. **Range Safety:** The safety of all involved is of paramount importance. All range safety rules will be strictly enforced. Any contestant failing to conform to safety standards will be warned or disqualified from the event. Minor infractions will be noted and marked on the contestant's badge. Repeated infractions or major safety violations will result in disqualification from the event
- b. **Sky Drawing:** Absolutely no sky drawing will be allowed. Any contestants seen sky drawing will be immediately disqualified.
- c. **Cases:** All bows must remain cased at all times while on grounds until the equipment inspection. After shooting bows must be cased before leaving the range.
- d. **Range Boundaries:** For multiple reasons, control of traffic on and around the range is essential. Please respect these boundaries and the directions of the officials.
- e. **Disruption:** Parents, coaches, and other individuals should remain positive and supportive, being careful not to disrupt or exhibit behaviours deemed detrimental to contestants or the operation of the match. Sanctions ranging from warning to ejection from the grounds or disqualification of contestants may be imposed for interference with the operation of the match or disruption of the events on a firing line or range.
- **16.** *Alcohol Policy*: Consumption, use and possession of alcohol by persons under the age of 21 is prohibited by law and is not permitted. Consumption, use and possession of alcohol is not permitted by parents, coaches, observers, and contestants during the shoot.
- 17. *Drug Policy:* Shooting is not allowed while under the influence of any drug or prescription medications that effect judgement and conduct to a degree that a participant is unsafe.
- **18.** *Tobacco Policy:* Smoking is not permitted by parents, coaches, observers, and contestants inside NRG Arena. Parents, coaches and observers should adhere to all posted no smoking signs and restrict use to designated areas only. Smoking use and possession of tobacco products (including smokeless) by minors is prohibited by law and is not permitted anywhere on the grounds at any time.

- **19. Interference:** If any contestant in any way, whether in person, or by agent, or servant, interferes with judges during their adjudication or shows disrespect to them, to the show or competition, they are subject to be penalized. Management may demand a proper apology from the contestant, may exclude him/her from competition, bar him/her from the grounds and may also withhold any prizes that may have been awarded.
- **20.** Photographs: All photographs taken by the official photographer become property of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. Unofficial (i.e. personal) photographs may not be published without the written approval of Management. Contestants wishing to purchase photographs must contact the official photographer.
 - a. Commercial photography and filming are often conducted at the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. You may be depicted in photographs or video recordings of any Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo event, and by entering the grounds and/or competitive events associated with the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, you consent to the use of any depictions in connection with advertising, news reporting, public relations, webcasts or other broadcasts, or any other activities relating to the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, and you further release and waive all claims for compensation and any rights of review and approval, copyright, and right of publicity with respect thereto.
- 21. Property/Security: All contestants or persons in charge of property, shall care for, guard, protect, and preserve same, as the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo do not undertake to do so and shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to said property of contestants thereof. All contestants are responsible for security of their own property. The contestant is the absolute insurer of and is responsible for the condition of their property. The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo is not responsible for the acts of a third party.
- 22. Official Scores: The official score is the record kept by the referee/scorer on a sheet furnished him/her by Management. The referee/scorer's decision is final. All reported scores are checked for accuracy and corrections will be made when required. Shoot officials maintain the objective of producing timely, accurate and complete scoring records for each event. They do not represent any club, county, team, or individual. The superintendent will be responsible for conducting any and all aspects of the event pertaining to "shooting". Including, but not limited to: target assignment, scoring, posting of scores, determination of winners, and rule interpretation.
- **23. Appeals:** A contestant may appeal a ruling on the range immediately if he/she feels a referee has missed a score. The scorer may poll the squad at his or her discretion. The decision of the referee on the range is final and not subject to further appeal. Parent/coach scoring is not official scoring and will not be consulted.
- 24. Protests: Contestants may only protest any injustice, violation of the rules, or other circumstance that may have resulted in placing them at a disadvantage relative to other contestants. Such conditions must be reported to the Superintendent(s) immediately. All protests must be in writing and be accompanied by a \$300 deposit which will not be returned if protest is not sustained by Show Management. Protest must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Show Management immediately after the occasion that prompted the protest. The Protest Jury will investigate and reach final resolution of the matter as soon as possible considering all circumstances. Results of all protests are final and will be reported to the contestant.
 - a. Protest Jury will include the Superintendent(s), Assistant Superintendent(s), Director Livestock Competitions and Senior Coordinator, Livestock Show
- 25. Accommodations Lodging is the responsibility of the contestant's party and will not be arranged by the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo.
- **26.** Coaching: A participant may not be coached while on the shooting line. Coaching includes any communication between the coach, parent or other spectator and the contestant; verbal or non-verbal. The contestant may request assistance from Management and Management may assign an assistant, in the event of a malfunction.

- 27. Dress Code: Participants and spectators are required to dress appropriately. Both young people and adults should wear attire appropriate for the weather while remaining modest and socially acceptable. Contestants must wear a shirt with sleeves. Clothing deemed immodest or distracting to other contestants will not be permitted. Fully enclosed shoes must be worn for safety reasons by both contestants and spectators. All contestants and coaches should consider their dress in that they may be having photographs taken or be asked to interview for the media.
- 28. Use of Two-Way Radios: To assist us in range and match operations, only authorized persons are permitted to use two-way radios on the grounds. Any action by either youth or adults interfering with the frequencies in use imposes a safety hazard. Deliberate disruption of range communication by anyone at the event will be considered a safety violation and will be treated as such.
- **29.** Top Archer Award: A Top Archer award will be handed out for the top male and top female score, determined by combining the qualifying score from the Target Competition and the 3-D score. Ties will be broken by combined count of x's from Target and 12's from 3-D.
- 30. Awards: The following prizes will be awarded to each class. Additional awards will be given at the discretion of HLSR.

3-D Archery Competition Special Rules

- 1. Format:
 - a. Each competition round will consist of one (1) round of twenty individual 3D targets.
 - b. Shooters will be permitted 90 seconds to range the target and execute the shot. Any arrow not fired by the end of the time will be scored as a zero (0).
 - c. Targets will be grouped into sets of 4 with shooters assigned to a target within the set. Shooters will shoot their first target in the set and rotate through the set. Arrows will be scored at the conclusion of the set. Shooters will then move to the next set, assume their beginning spots in the set and continue the process. Each shooter will need a minimum of 4 arrows.
- 2. Entry Limits: There is no limit to the number of individuals each group may enter. The right is reserved, by Management, to reject entirely or accept conditionally any entry and to refuse any accepted entry admittance to the grounds.
 - **a.** Exhibitors may only have one entry.
 - i. Exhibitor may only have one entry per preliminary round.
 - ii. Exhibitor must provide the appropriate bow for each entry to be eligible for that bow class.
 - **b.** Overall entries will not be limited. Initially available will be four rounds on Saturday and two rounds Sunday morning for up to 80 Exhibitors per round.
 - i. 20 spots will be available per distance.
 - ii. Additional rounds will be added based on need and at the discretion of the Superintendent and Show Officials

Eagle Recurve allows the use of Barebow Recurve, Olympic Recurve, Traditional/Longbow, or a universal one-size fits all bow approved for use in NASP competition with a maximum draw weight of 20# along with Easton XX75 Genesis Series aluminum arrows.

- 4. Equipment:
 - a. The event will adhere to a maximum draw weight for each shooter of 60 LBS. (See rule 5)
 - b. Use of a sight light is permitted.
 - c. Range finders are permitted but not required. Each target distance will be marked. Each round will be all known distance.
 - d. Each shooter must be able to draw their bow under control and without undue difficulty. Sky Drawing is not allowed.
 - e. Cell Phones and other electronic devices are to be silenced and their use for communication or accessing apps is prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to, sight mark applications.
 - f. Only one arrow, per shooter, per target will be shot from the designated stake. Anyone shooting the wrong target will receive a zero (0) for the target which should have been shot.
 - g. An arrow that drops while being nocked onto the string in preparation for a shot may be picked up and shot with no penalty. If, in the process of letting down, an arrow drops off the bow or is jarred off by hand contact with the bow, it may be picked up and shot with no penalty. The shooter is responsible for always maintaining control of the arrow and an arrow must not be released or otherwise propelled by the string or it will be scored as a zero.
 - h. Lighted arrow nocks are not permitted.
 - i. Open Class Equipment Rules for Young Adult & Youth:
 - i. May use any compound or recurve bow, sight, release, stabilizer, or equipment unless specifically prohibited in any other part of these rules or by a ruling of the Competition Committee. HLSR reserves the right to review any equipment / accessories and determine its suitability for competition.
 - j. Fixed Pin Equipment Rules for Young Adult, Youth and Eagle: Sights
 - i. All Eagle, 30- and 40-yard classes use fixed pins with no pin limit. A movable sight may be used but must be locked down into a fixed position that will be verified by the group prior to competing. Magnification is permitted in 40-yard classes. Clarifiers or verifiers in the peep are not considered magnification and are permitted in all classes.
 - k. Arrow Rule for Young Adult, Youth & Eagle Class:
 - i. The maximum diameter of arrow shafts will not exceed 9.3mm or .366"; and the field or glue-in point for these arrows will have a maximum diameter of 9.4 mm or .370". No changes or alterations to the manufacturer's exterior finish and markings are permitted, except for the addition of fletching wraps or that occur during use.

3-D Archery Competition Special Rules

- Draw Weight: A <u>maximum draw weight of 60 lbs</u> will be allowed for the competition. Draw weight will be verified on a case by case basis at the discretion of the Superintendent. You will be asked your draw weight during Bow Check. Anyone found to exceed the draw weight during competition will be subject to disqualification.
- 6. Eagle Recurve allows the use of Barebow Recurve, Olympic Recurve, Traditional/Longbow or a universal one-size fits all bow approved for use in NASP competition with a maximum draw weight of 20# along with Easton XX75 Genesis Series aluminum arrows.
 - a. If in the opinion of the Range Official anyone in Youth or Eagle is having difficulty drawing and controlling the bow, they will be required to decrease the poundage to allow them to properly draw and shoot the bow, regardless of arrow speed, to be able to participate.
 - b. **Stabilizers** A front stabilizer or a system including quick releases, enhancers and/or weights may be used, but may not exceed twelve inches (12") in total length from the tip of the stabilizer (or system) to the point of attachment on the front of the riser of the bow. A single rear stabilizer up to twelve inches (12") in length (including weights) may be used regardless of the point of attachment to the bow.
- 7. Equipment Failure: There is no allowance for equipment failure during the round. Competitors in Fixed Pins classes may make one gang adjustment of their sight during the competition.

8. Scoring Rules

- a. Official Scores will be kept by a volunteer scorekeeper assigned to each group. Contestants will not be handling scoring but can request clarification or correction if they think there is an issue.
- b. All information on the scorecard must be accurate with all information completely and properly filled in. Information blocks and signatures that are incorrect or incomplete will result in a deduction of ten points. If the score was incorrect the ten (10) point deduction will be taken from the correct score.
- c. If the number of 12 Rings™ is left blank, it will be scored as zero.
- d. Scorekeepers will maintain the official-colored scorecard for each shooter and be responsible for recording each arrow on the corresponding target number and maintaining the running total. Scorekeepers will confirm with the shooter that their total score and number of 12 Rings™ is correct at the end of the round.

9. Scoring

- a. All arrows must remain in the target until all arrows are scored:
 - i. The arrow shaft must be touching a portion of the next highest scoring line to be scored for the higher value.
 - ii. Scorers are allowed to use their binoculars and may also reflect or shine a light on the target at the time of scoring to aid in the process.
 - iii. The status of any doubtful arrows must be determined before drawing any arrow from the target.
 - iv. The score is based on the status of the arrow while all other arrows remain in the target.
 - v. Arrows may not be removed until a scoring judgment has been made and no changes may be made to the score after removal of an arrow.
 - vi. Targets may not be moved or dislodged for scoring purposes and shall be returned to their proper upright position upon removal of the arrows.
- b. Scorers will agree on a score for each arrow and call out the results to be recorded on the respective shooter's scorecards by their Scorekeepers.
 - i. If the two designated scorers cannot agree on a score another member of the group will break the tie other than the shooter whose arrow is being scored.
 - ii. In classes with only three shooters in the group the shooter will receive the higher score of the two scorers.
 - iii. ASA Range Officials will not make arrow calls except when a group has only two shooters, or during special competitions.
- c. Target "Pass Through" or "Rebound" without striking another arrow:
 - i. Arrows passing through the front of, but still in, the target will be pushed back and scored;
 - ii. If the group agrees that an arrow passed through the targets insert seam the shooter will be given a score based on the point of pass through not to exceed eight (8) points;
 - iii. If the group agrees and confirms that the arrow actually passed through the target scoring area due to the high number of arrows that had been shot at the target, the range official is to be notified to have the core replaced and the shooter will be allowed to take the score where the "pass-through" occurred as determined by the group up to a maximum score of ten (10) points; and
 - iv. If the group agrees that the arrow rebounded out of the target without striking another, the shooter can take the score up to a maximum of ten (10) points. Special Note: A score of 12 will not be permitted under sections 2, 3 or 4 of this paragraph.
- d. An arrow that **glances off** and goes past the target will be scored as a "0" (includes glancing off a plastic leg.)
- e. Any arrow **embedding** ("Robin Hood") in the nock of another arrow will be scored the same as the arrow it is embedded in.


- f. Any arrow **rebounding** backward off another Arrow (a "Robin Hood" that strikes and damages another arrow and does not proceed toward the target but bounces back) will be scored the same as the arrow it struck, provided the damaged arrow can be identified.
- g. Any arrow **deflecting** by contact with another arrow already in the target and still proceeding toward the target will be scored where it lies in the target, or a maximum of five (5) points if it is not in the target.
- h. Arrows in the corresponding area of the target will be scored with point values of 5, 8, 10, or 12.
- 10. Top Archer Award: A Top Archer award will be handed out for the top male and top female score, determined by combining the qualifying score from the Target Competition and the 3-D score. Ties will be broken by combined count of x's from Target and 12's from 3-D.
- 11. Awards: Cash Awards will be issued based on the number of shooters in each class. Additional awards will be given at the discretion of HLSR.
