From the Bowhunting Director

Summer is in full swing, and that means it's time to start thinking about fall food plots. Whether you are planting for hunting season attraction, post-rut nutrition, or just want to keep local deer healthy heading into winter, now is the time to get a plan in place.

Successful food plots require more than just broadcasting seed on bare dirt. From soil sampling and lime application to proper seed selection, weed control, and actual planting, every step matters —

Texas archery deer season for 2025-2026 is September 27 to October 31. Texas has new regulations for statewide carcass disposal of deer. The preferred method is to leave unused carcass parts at the property of harvest, as this greatly reduces the chance of spreading Chronic Wasting Disease to other parts of the state. The best practice is to be buried at least three feet below the ground and covered with at least three feet of earthen material. Check your local restrictions and requirements on Texas Parks & Wildlife at tpwd.texas.gov

Important information for those who would like to shoot both days of the 900 or 3-D Championships.

Given the 900 & Known 3D State Championships are the only State Championships we allow shooting in more than one Style or Age class the following should help to clarify the opportunity to do so.

On Day one:

Register in your usual style and age class.

On Day two:

- You may **shoot a different eligible Style** in your Age class.
- Age classes run Cub (8-11), Youth (12-14), Young Adult (15-17), Adult (18-49), Senior (50-59), Silver Senior (60-69), Master Senior (70 +)

Or

- You may **shoot a lower Age class from Master down to Adult**, with Adult being the lowest Age class.
- You may **shoot a higher Age class from Cub to Adult**, with Adult being the highest Age class.
- If you choose to shoot in a different age class in the same style, please send an email to info@texasfieldarchery.org so we can help you get registered for the second day.

Normal Age grouping restrictions apply.

- Adult class and above may not shoot up in Age class, (i.e. Senior, Silver Senior, Master).
- Adult class and below may not shoot down in Age class, (i.e. Young Adult, Youth, Cub)

900 American Round - 5 Ends of 6 arrows = 30 arrows at each of Long, Medium , and Short distances by age group:

- Cubs (8-11) will shoot at 30-20-10 yards
- Youth (12-14) will shoot at 50-40-30 yards
- Young Adult and all Adult Classes will shoot at 60-50-40 yards
- The target for all distances is the standard 122cm FITA target face with scoring rings from 10 to 1.
- X's to count as tie breaker.
- Each End has a 5 Minute Time limit.

Format:

Known 3D, Archers will shoot 2 arrows per 28 Targets at known distance.

Distances will be marked at the Target number. (Range Finders allowed)

Cubs will shoot a maximum of 25 yards (Blue stakes)

Barebow Recurve, Longbow and Traditional will shoot a max of 25 yards (Blue stakes)

Barebow will shoot a maximum of 40 yards (Yellow stakes)

Youth and Master Senior will shoot a maximum of 40 yards (Yellow stakes)

All Others will shoot a maximum of 50 yards (White stakes)

Scoring:

- · 10pts- Larger Inner Circle,
- 8 pts Outer Circle/Kill Zone
- · 5 pts Body
- · There is no 11, 12, or 14 ring score

Commencing 2018, TFAA has awarded scholarships to deserving young men and women who have demonstrated academic, community and archery success. Currently, each year TFAA awards one scholarship to a high school senior in the amount of \$5,000. TFAA, a non-profit corporation holds approximately \$32,000 in the TFAA Scholarship Fund, and the short-term goal is to increase the fund to \$100,000 and operate as endowment disbursing 5% annually. In the following few years, it is the goal to increase the endowment fund to \$1,000,000 so that scholarships in the cumulative amount of \$50,000 may be awarded to deserving TFAA high school seniors. To further these goals TFAA is hereby respectfully asking for donations to the TFAA Scholarship Fund.
