## Attention Parents of Youth Shooters

Please note NFAA/TFAA rules state that an archer moves up to a higher age division on their birthday. This means that if your child will have a birthday between now and the start of our State Championship, they must shoot in the higher age division for the remainder of the SYWAT season and in the state shoot. In anticipation of this, you are allowed to move your child up in age division during or at the start of the SYWAT season. Once a shooter moves up in age division, they must remain in that division. TFAA, Shoot Your Way Across Texas ("SYWAT") indoor season has been great. District 5 has had 18 SYWATs plus the Southern Sectionals, with a total of 1,643 rounds shot. This Indoor Season will wrap up with another SYWAT at Alvarado Archery, followed by the TFAA Indoor State Championship Tournament at Cinnamon Creek Ranch.

Thereafter, we immediately jump into Field season. There are Field shoots scheduled at Cowtown and Irving Bowhunters Association ("IBA"). Field archery is my favorite, and I hope to see you participating in the upcoming Field season.

If you have not participated before, please come and join us. Field season competition requires archers to shoot 112 arrows at four different size targets depending on the distance, which goes from 30 feet to 80 yards. Cubs (ages 8-11) and Youth shoot from closer distances. Field SYWATs are fun and are a great introduction for beginner archers. SYWATs are friendly, but do offer stiff competition for more advanced shooters preparing for the season ending TFAA State Field Championship in June at IBA. If you do not have someone you know attending and you cannot make it, **I will be happy to pick up your plaque for you and bring to the San Antonio Area shops for you to retrieve.** We have approximately 547 SYWAT Plaques this year and about 440 state shooters. That means about a 100 folks have plaques that need a ride home. Please help make that happen.

## **Request for Donations to the TFAA Scholarship Fund**

Commencing 2018, TFAA has awarded scholarships to deserving young men and women who have demonstrated academic, community and archery success. Currently, each year TFAA awards one scholarship to a high school senior in the amount of \$5,000. TFAA, a non-profit corporation holds approximately \$32,000 in the TFAA Scholarship Fund, and the short-term goal is to increase the fund to \$100,000 and operate as endowment disbursing 5% annually. In the following few years, it is the goal to increase the endowment fund to \$1,000,000 so that scholarships in the cumulative amount of \$50,000 may be awarded to deserving TFAA high school seniors. That will be awesome. To further these goals TFAA is hereby respectfully asking for donations to the TFAA Scholarship Fund.

# TFAA By-Laws Addition

**The TFAA Board of Directors met recently and adopted the following to the TFAA By-Laws:**

**No Dogs at TFAA State Events:** With the exception of Service Animals as described herein, No dogs, or other animals are allowed at TFAA State Events.

**Service Animals:** Service animals are defined as dogs that are individually trained to do work or perform tasks for people with disabilities. Examples of such work or tasks include guiding who are blind, alerting people who are deaf, pulling a wheelchair, or alerting and protecting a person who is having a seizure, reminding a person with mental illness to take prescribed medications, calming a person with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) during an anxiety attack, or performing other duties. Service animals are working animals, not pets. The work or task a dog has been trained to provide must be directly related to the person's disability. Dogs or other service animals whose sole function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

**Note: Per TFAA Policy, Emotional Support Animals, which differ from Service Animals, do not enjoy the same legal status as service animals per the ADA, and are not allowed on the field of play.**

**Where Service Animals Are Allowed:** Per the ADA, State and local governments, businesses, and nonprofit organizations that serve the public generally must allow service animals to accompany people with disabilities in all areas of the facility where the public is normally allowed to go. At TFAA Archery events, service animals are allowed in the archers' area, which is defined as any place the archer is allowed. Archers needing accommodation outside of these guidelines are to be managed on a case by case basis.

**Service Animals Must Be Under Control:** Per the ADA, service animals must be harnessed, leashed, or tethered, unless these devices interfere with the service animal's work or the individual's disability prevents using these devices. In that case, the individual must maintain control of the animal through voice, signal, or other effective controls.

**Service animals should always demonstrate the following behaviors:**

- Be focused on their handler
- Have a stable, even temperament
- Remain quietly by their handler's side
- Ignore distractions
- Present professional
- Keep their nose to themselves
- Respond promptly to handler's cues and directions

**Inquiries, Exclusions, Charges and Other Specific Rules Related to Service Animals:** When it is not obvious what service an animal provides, only limited inquiries are allowed. Staff may ask two questions: (1) is the dog a service animal required because of a disability, and (2) what work, or task has the dog been trained to perform. Staff cannot ask about the person's disability, require medical documentation, require a special identification card or training documentation for the dog, or ask that the dog demonstrate its ability to perform the work or task.

Note: This policy is based on the USA Archery policy updated December 2023.

## ***A Note About Line Etiquette***

It's great to see the growth and influx of new archers. Many are shooting competitions for the first time. Shops and coaches are doing a great job of teaching archery, but let's not forget line etiquette. This will make the competition experience a lot better for the new shooters, other archers on the line, and officials running the shoot.

1. Be ready when your line is called, then walk, don't run, to the shooting line.
2. Be careful not to bump the shooters in front or behind you while approaching/leaving the line, or while shooting.
3. Never talk to another shooter, or to yourself while on the shooting line.
4. Never talk to anyone behind the line while you are on the shooting line.
5. If the shooter on either side of you is going to full draw, or at full draw, wait quietly in place until they have shot before leaving the line.
6. Leave the line quietly.
7. After leaving the line, move away from the shooting line, rack your bow and wait far enough behind the shooting line so you won't disturb those still shooting.
8. If a shooter near you is the last person still shooting, quietly remain on the line with them for support. This is a polite and appreciated gesture.

## TFAA 2025 State Championship February 28 - March 2, 2025

### Things to know, Before you go

**PLEASE NOTE:** Road Construction is blocking the entrance to CCR from the south. You will need to take IH35W north to Eagle Parkway..... Turn East on Eagle Parkway and then turn south on Elizabethtown Cemetery Road, about 1/4 mile from the freeway. Follow the signs to Cinnamon Creek. Please allow an additional 15 minutes or so for your commute. Detour Map below and [HERE](#)

**If you require extra space for shooting** (wheelchair, etc.), please email Mark Tanner (marketanner@att.net) and update your archer profile with your requirements. We will be glad to accommodate you if we are aware of your needs.

**This is a two-day shoot....** If you shoot on Saturday at 7:30, 11:15 or 3:00, your Sunday time will be assigned to get all shooters of a class together. We will have an awards ceremony after each Sunday line. Sunday assignments will be posted on the Thursday before the tournament.

If you are registered for the Friday/Saturday line, you will shoot at 6:30 pm both days. You do not shoot Sunday.

**NFAA/TFAA membership required.** If you have a sticker on your scorecard you need to contact Betty in the tournament office to clarify your membership status. Non-members will be listed as Guest and will not be eligible for awards.

**NO CHECK IN.** Your scorecards will be on your bale.

All 20-yard shooters shoot in the EVENT CENTER  
Cubs for the Saturday and Sunday lines shoot in the PRO SHOP (Go directly to the Pro Shop)  
Cubs for the Friday/Saturday line shoot in the EVENT CENTER

**NO BOW CASES INSIDE THE BUILDINGS.** Space is limited. Also, no personal chairs, ice chests, etc.

**No Pets, except Service Animals** with official documentation.

**Practice for 10 and 20 yard shooters** will be available in the Event Center Friday from noon until 5:00 pm. After that, the range is reserved for 6:30 pm shooters.

Limited practice space will be available Saturday downstairs in the Pro Shop.

**Practice Targets - \$1.00 (Cash).** Proceeds go to the TFAA Youth Scholarship.

- **SYWAT Plaques will be available in the Event Center Pavilion.** If you know of someone not attending, please pick up their plaque and deliver it to them.

# TFAA State Championship Shoot Off Procedures

We anticipate an extremely competitive State Championship this year and the possibility of scoring ties is likely. We need the cooperation of those shooting to help the organizers identify those classes with tied scores so we can hold the shoot-off in a timely manner and not delay the awards ceremonies.

In the case of tight competitions, archers are encouraged to look up first day scores and identify those they are in close competition with. On Sunday, those competitors will be shooting together and should compare scores after the round to identify if there is, or the potential for, a tie.

**In the event of a potential tie, the archers as a group should bring their scorecards directly to the tournament office for expedited entry into the system (We will have someone in the Pro Shop to collect and enter Cub scores).** Once a tie is confirmed, the group will be directed to the TFAA Tournament Director who will organize and run the shoot-off.

Those archers shooting the Friday/Saturday line must take responsibility for keeping track of first day scores for their class and be aware of the possibility of a shoot-off. Any shoot-off will be held on Sunday, immediately following the line for that class. Friday/Saturday shooters will be allowed to shoot in the shoot-off but must be present to win.

# Registration Information for the TFAA State Indoor Championship

**This is a Two Day Tournament (The Registration Fee Covers Both Days)**

**You must shoot both days to be eligible for awards.**

**Friday/Saturday Line** - This line will shoot at 6:30 pm both day (No changes) [You will not shoot on Sunday]. Note: If you shoot Friday/Saturday, your class awards will be on Sunday.

**Saturday Lines** (7:30 am, 11:15 am, or 3:00 pm) - You may choose one of these times for your Saturday shoot time (space available). (Cubs will have the option of 11:15 am or 3:00 pm)

**Sunday Shoot Times** - Those shooting the Saturday Lines will be **ASSIGNED their Sunday shoot time**. This is done in order to get all of a division/style together for award purposes. We schedule the youth classes early so archers may travel back home for school Monday. Cubs will shoot at either 7:30 am or 11:15 am (classes to be determined)  
All Youth will shoot at 7:30 am  
All Young Adults will shoot at 11:15 am  
Adult classes will be distributed as required to balance the lines

**There will be an awards ceremony following each Sunday line** If you shoot Friday/Saturday, your class awards will be on Sunday.

**Sunday Shoot Times by Individual will be posted on the TFAA website by the Thursday before the tournament.**

The registration system will select your age division based on your birthdate. If you intend to shoot in an age division other than your normal age class, you will need to contact [info@texasfieldarchery.org](mailto:info@texasfieldarchery.org) or call Mark Tanner at 214-770-5903. ## About SYWAT Outdoor

The Outdoor *Shoot Your Way Across Texas* – or SYWAT – is a Field archery tournament series held at various locations around the state.

A Field archery round consists of shooting 4 arrows at 28 targets for a total of 112 arrows. The maximum score is 560 points.

The TFAA field round consists of 14 Field target faces and 14 Hunter target faces **or** 28 Field target faces **or** 28 Hunter target faces. Field target faces are black and white with a black center; Hunter target faces are all black with thin white rings and a white center. Target face size varies depending on the distance of each target. Scoring rings on the target face are X (5 points), 5, 4 and 3.

There are signs at each target that indicate distance and shooting position for each age class. Shooting positions may include all four arrows from one position, a series of four walk-up positions, or a fan layout of four positions.

Each shoot at each shop/club on a given weekend is its own tournament. Line times vary, and are frequently shotgun start, so be sure to check the host location's web site to confirm. Archers can shoot in one or more lines at the same location on the same weekend; only the highest score for that tournament will count.

Archers' three highest scores from tournaments throughout the season are posted on the TFAA web site. The shooter from each Division/Style with the top score from their three SYWAT shoots plus **both** State Championship scores wins a Shooter of the Year award.

### ***TFAA Membership***

TFAA Membership is not required to shoot in SYWAT tournaments, but is required to be eligible for awards at the TFAA Outdoor State Championship.

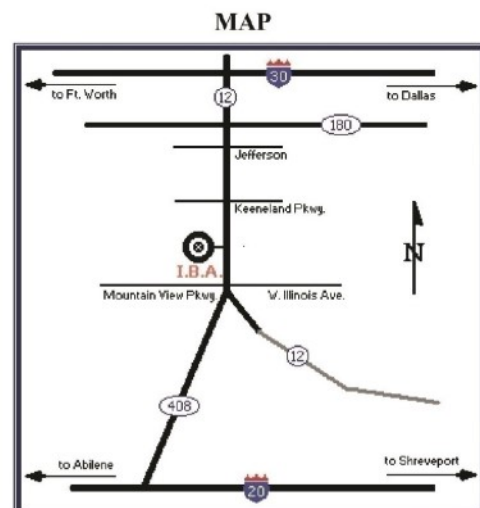

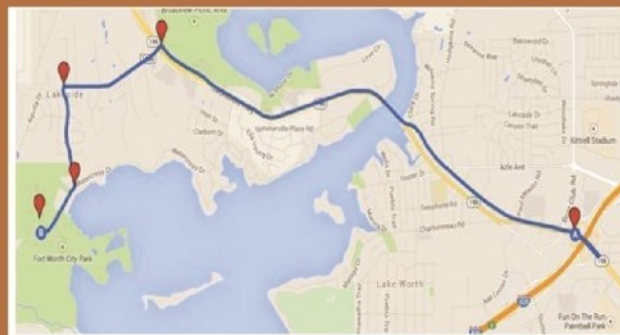

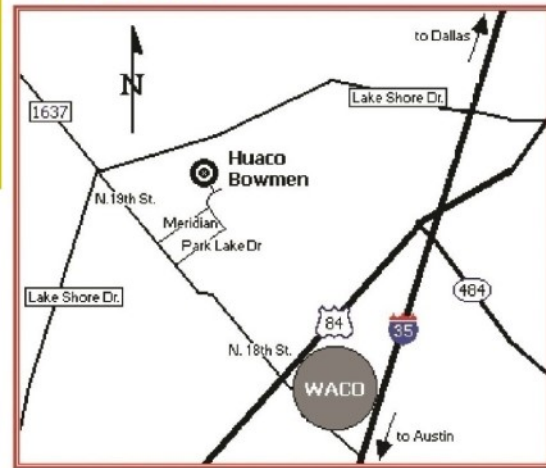
